

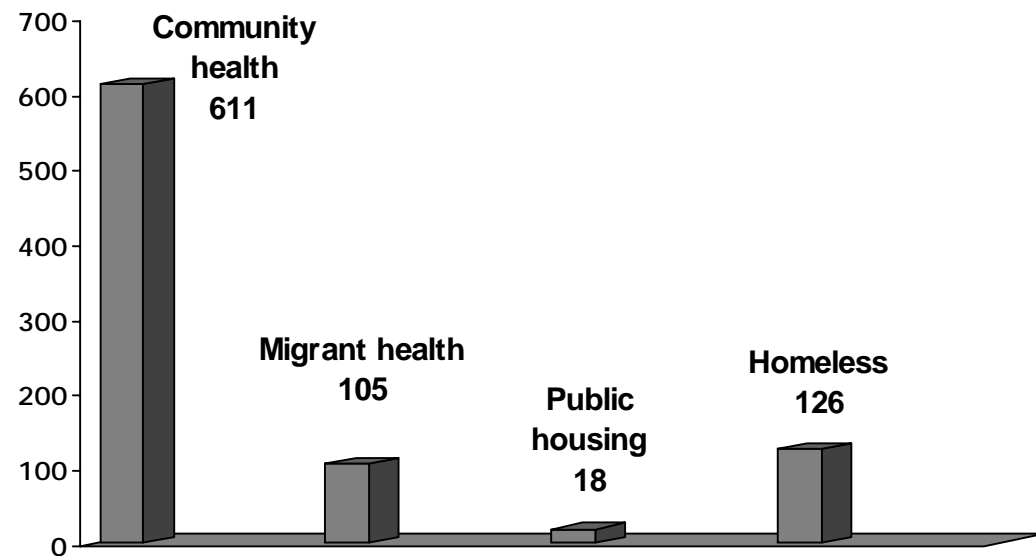

Figure 2. Health Center Patients by Age

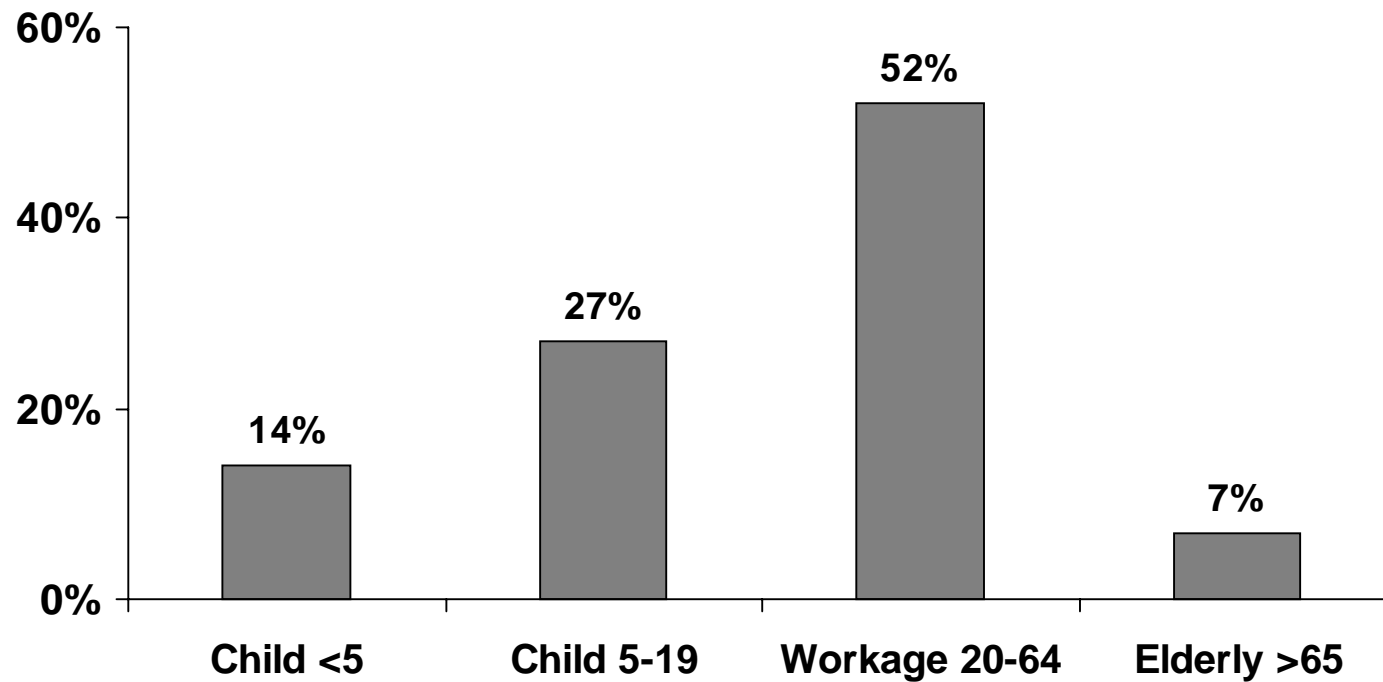
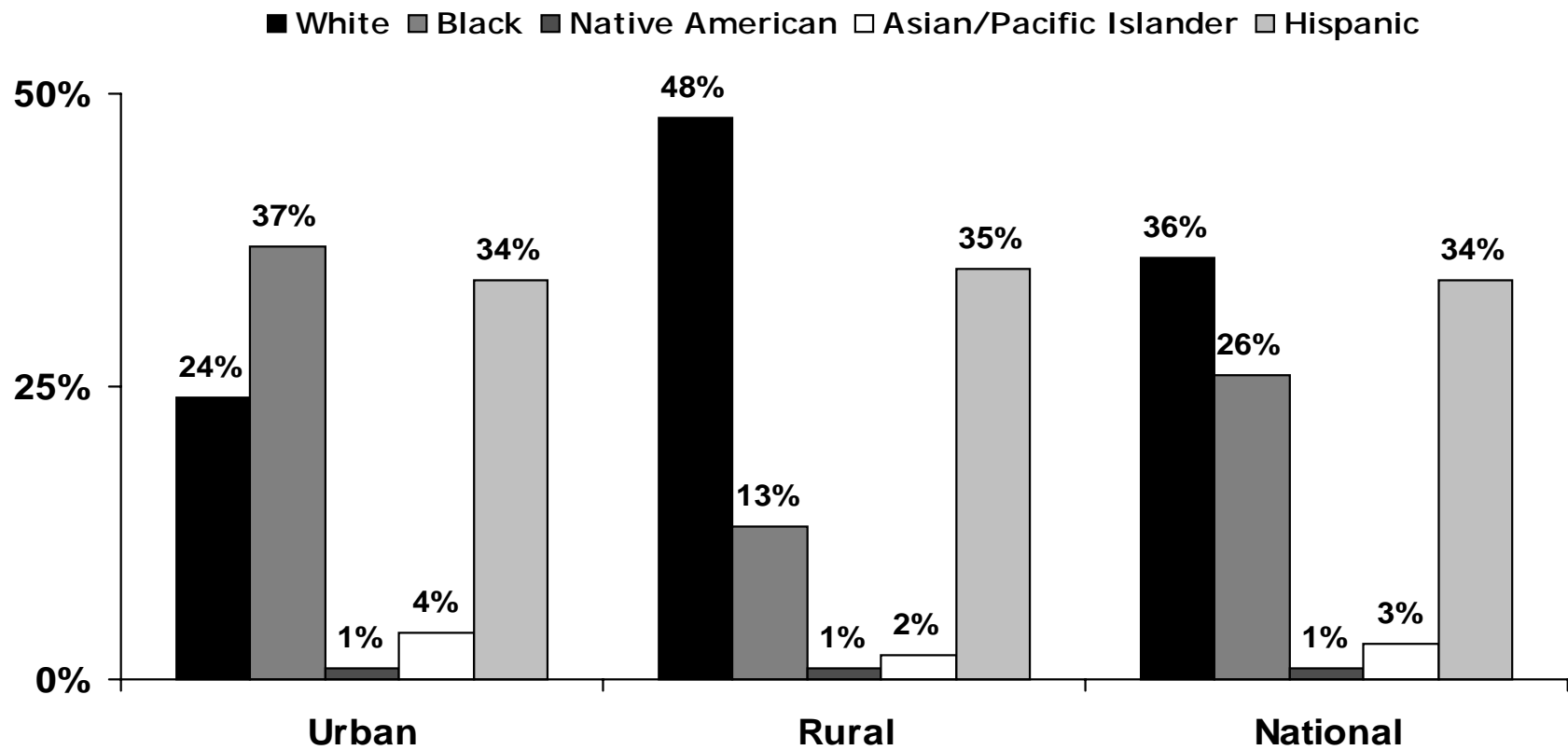


Figure 3. Health Center Patients by Race and Ethnicity

Figure 4. Health Center Patients by Family Income

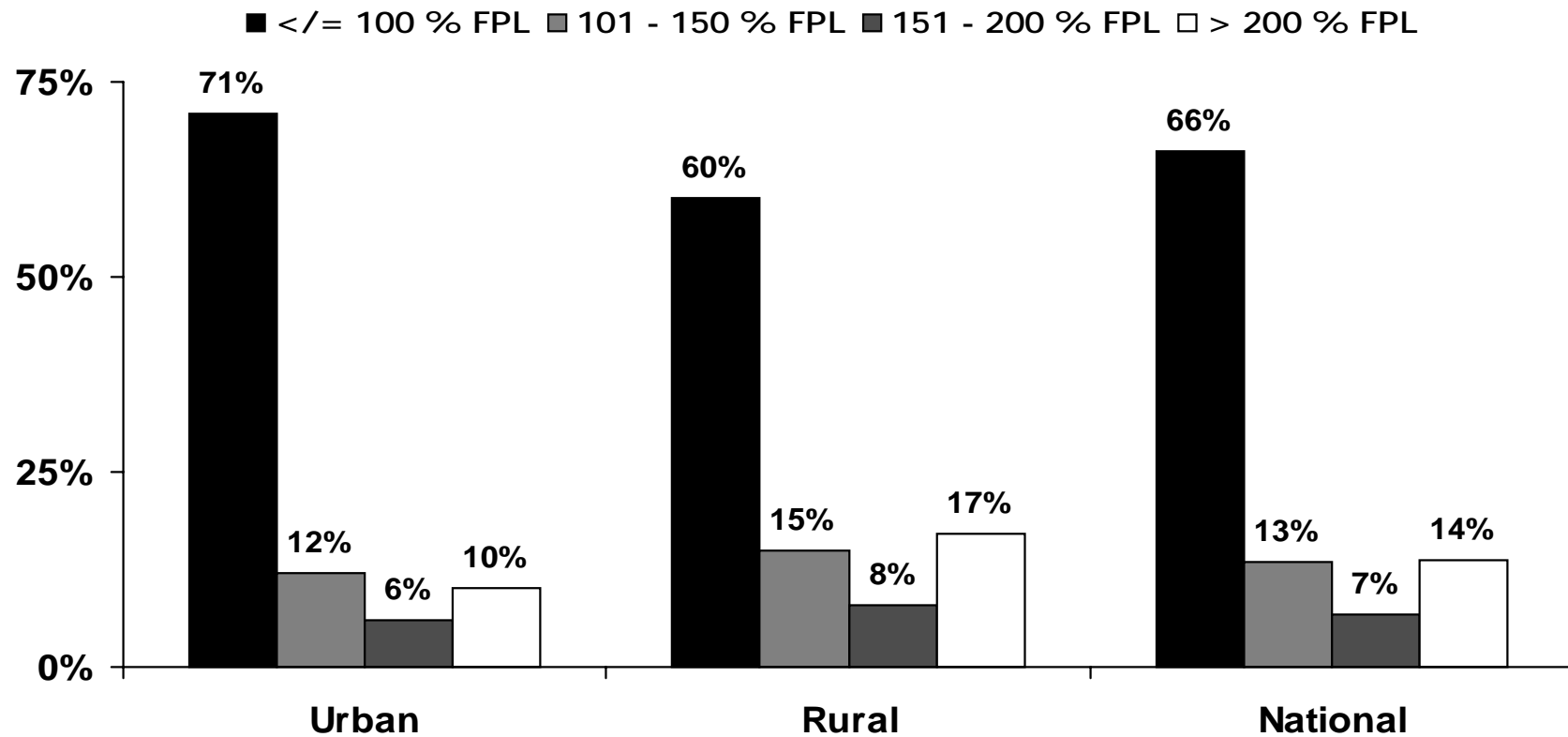
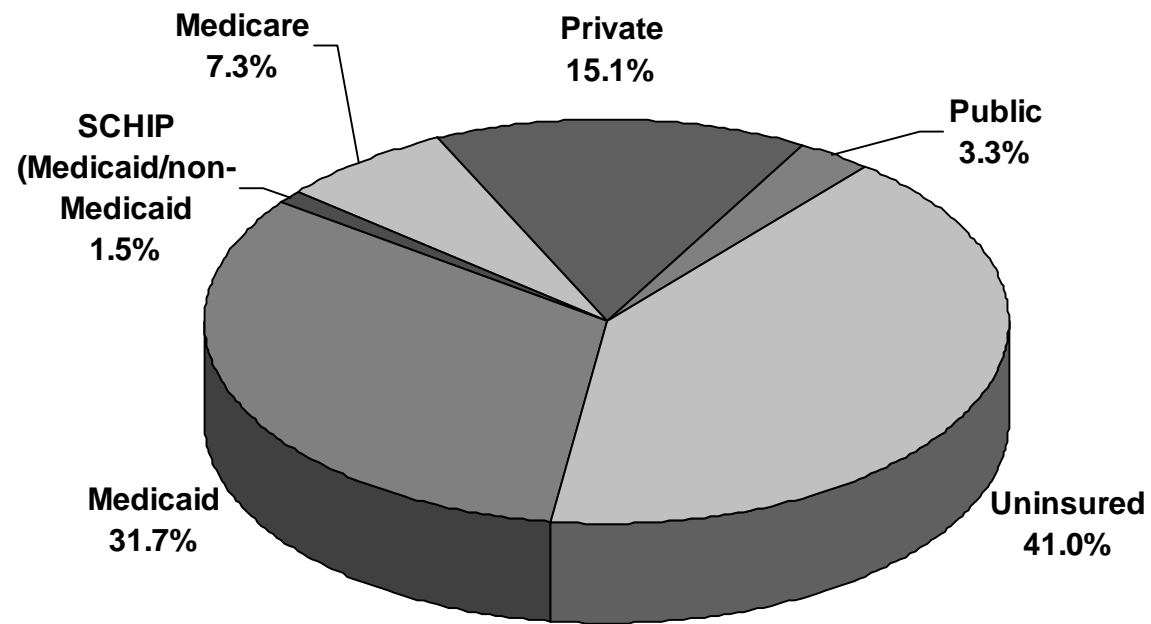
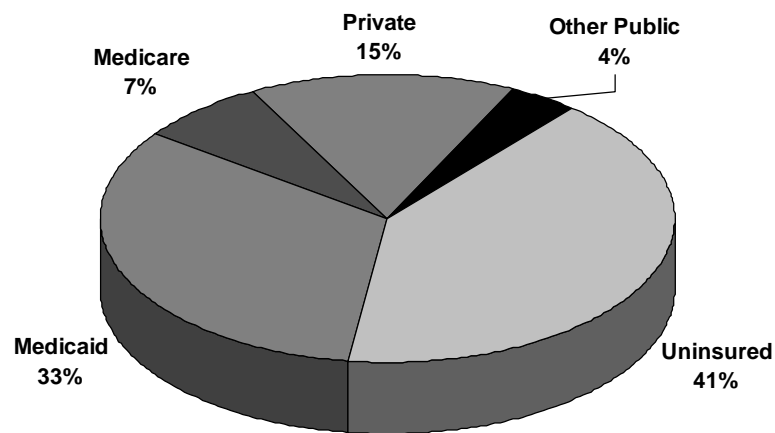


Figure 5. Health Center Patients by Insurance Status

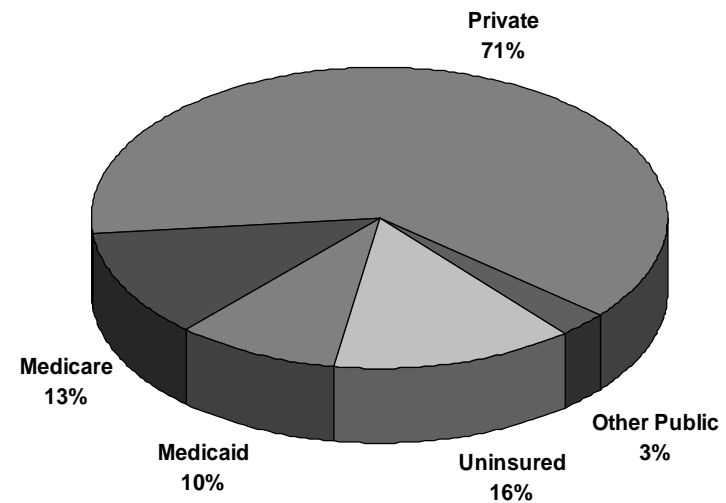

Figure 6. Health Insurance Status: Health Center Patients and U.S. Population



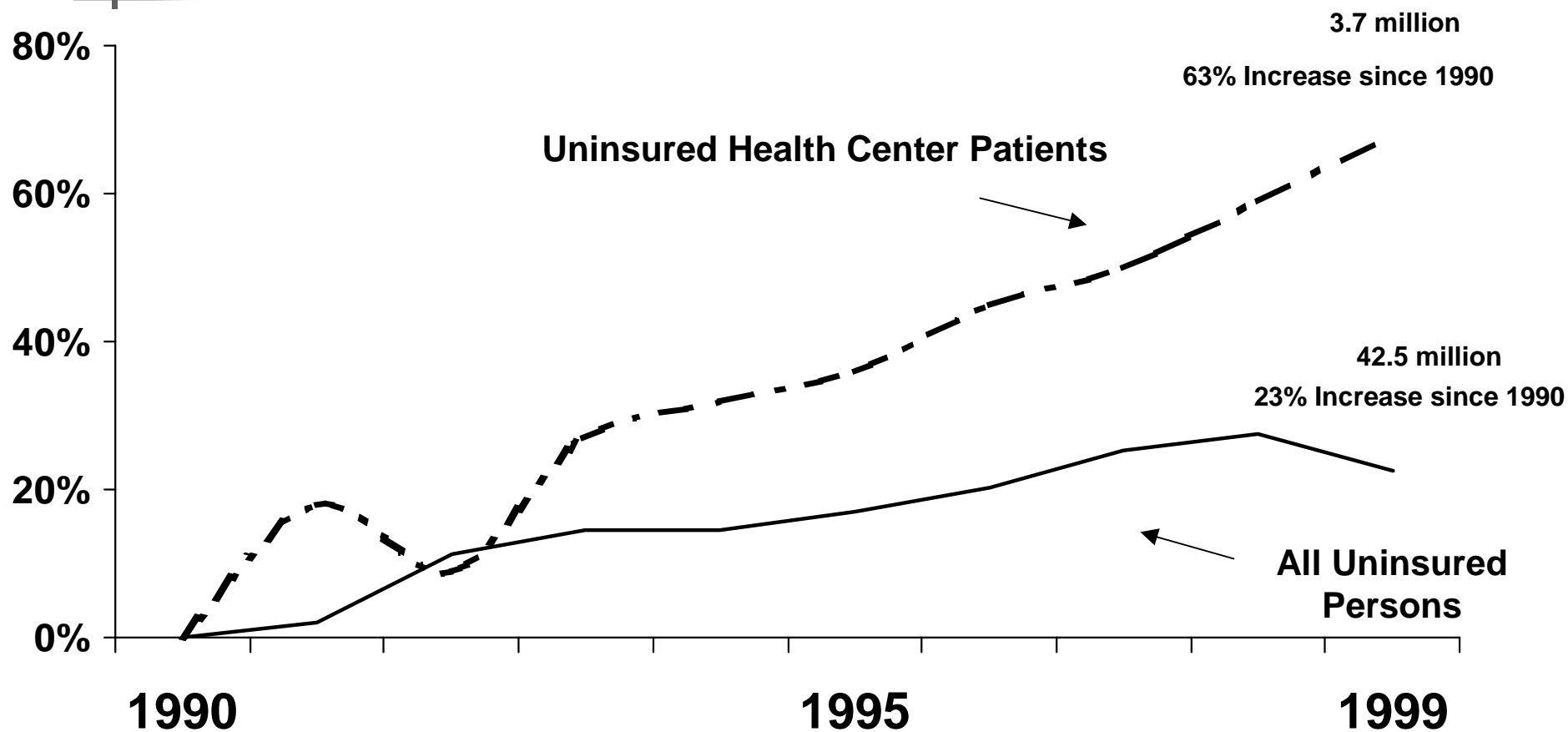

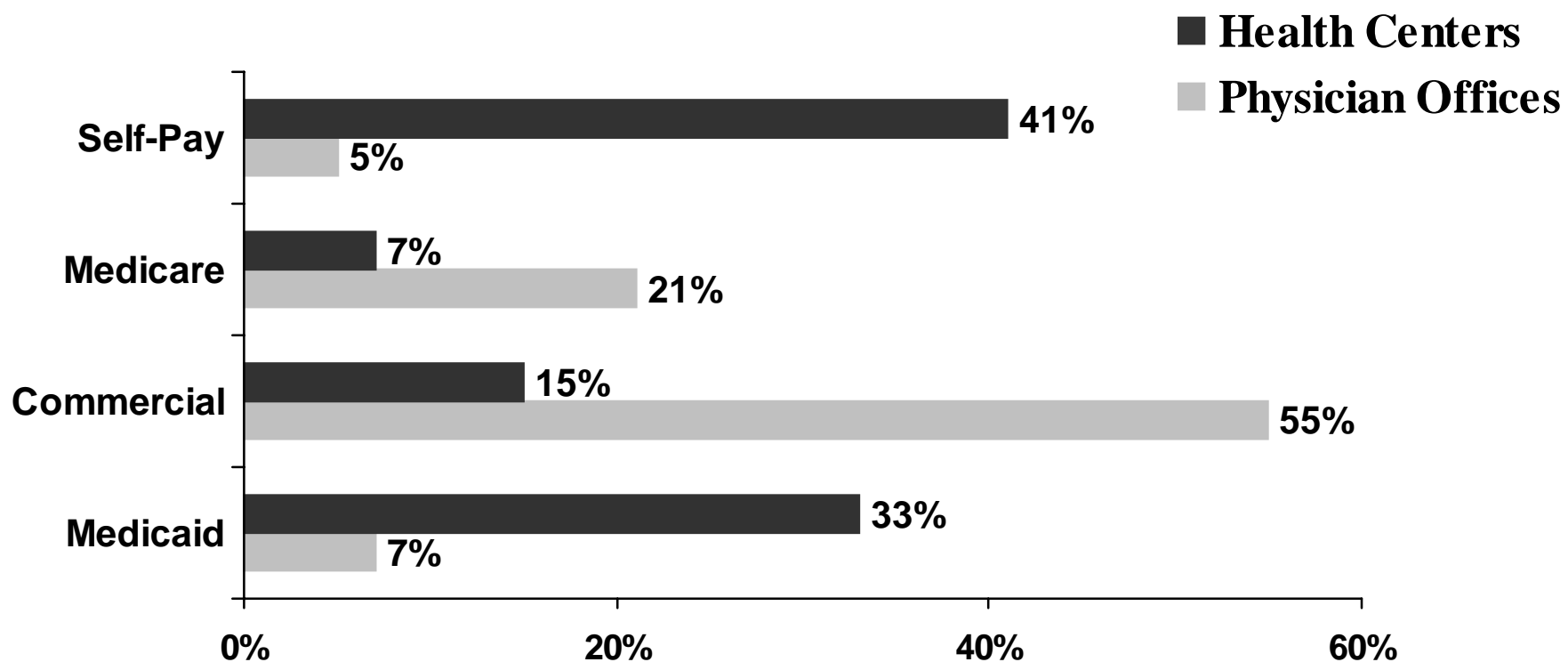
Figure 8. Key Subpopulations of Health Center Patients

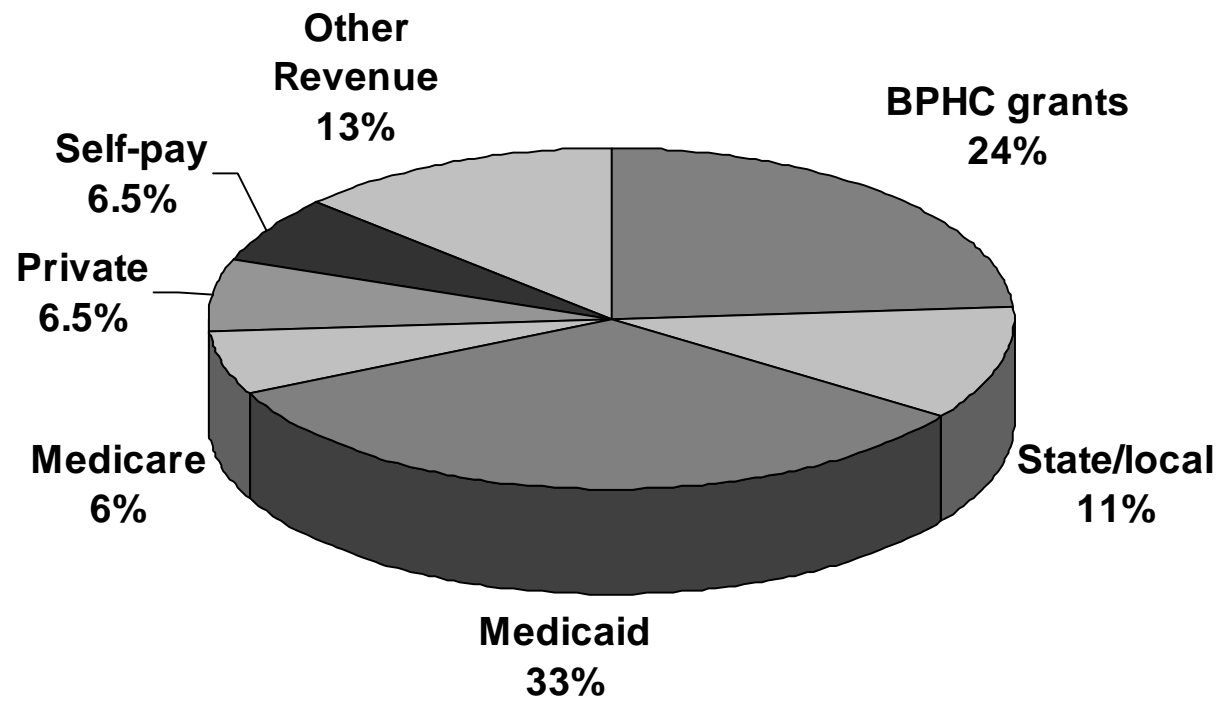

Figure 9. Health Center and Physician Office Patients by Insurance Status



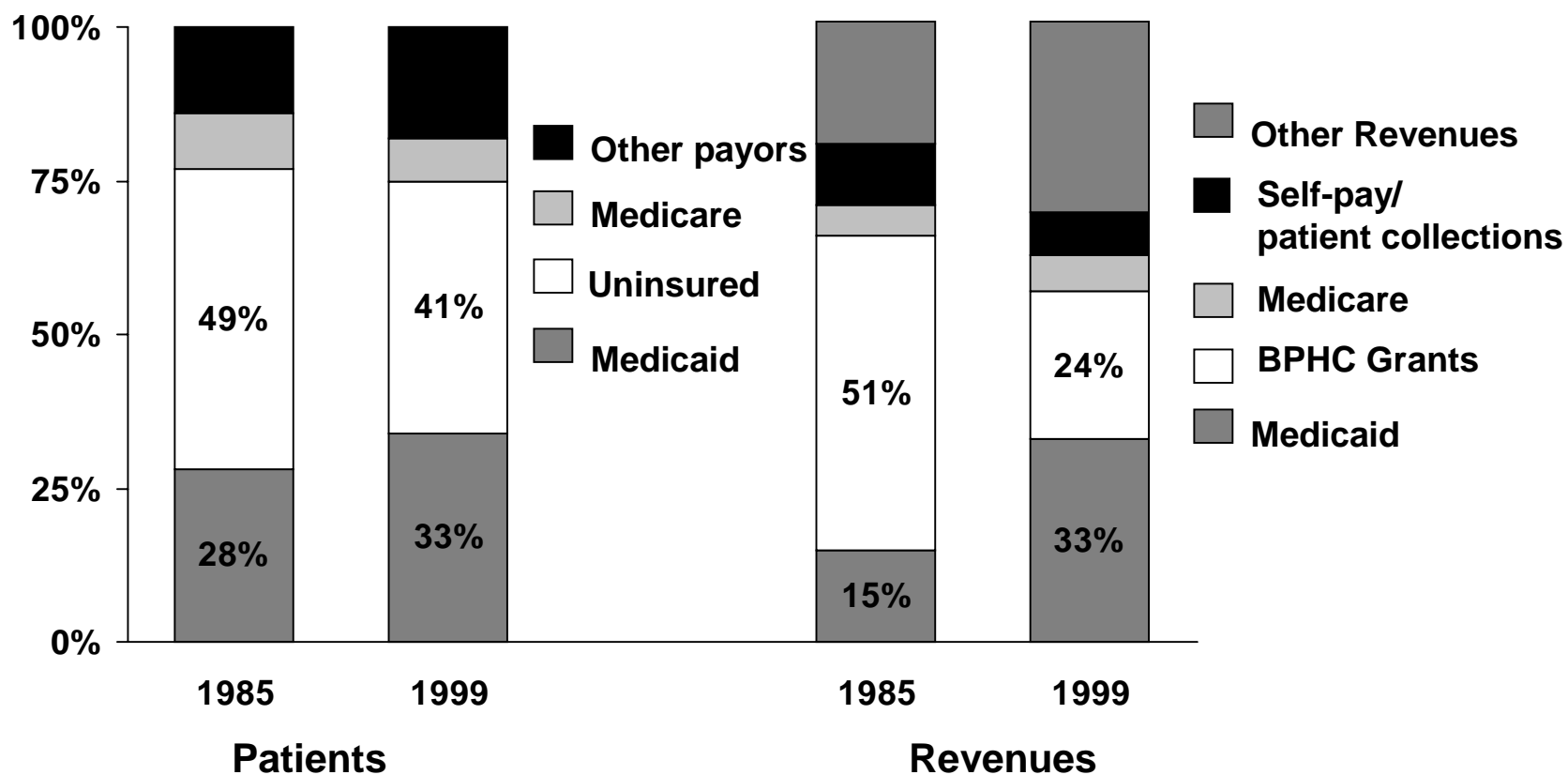

Figure 12. Health Center Encounters and Service Expenditures

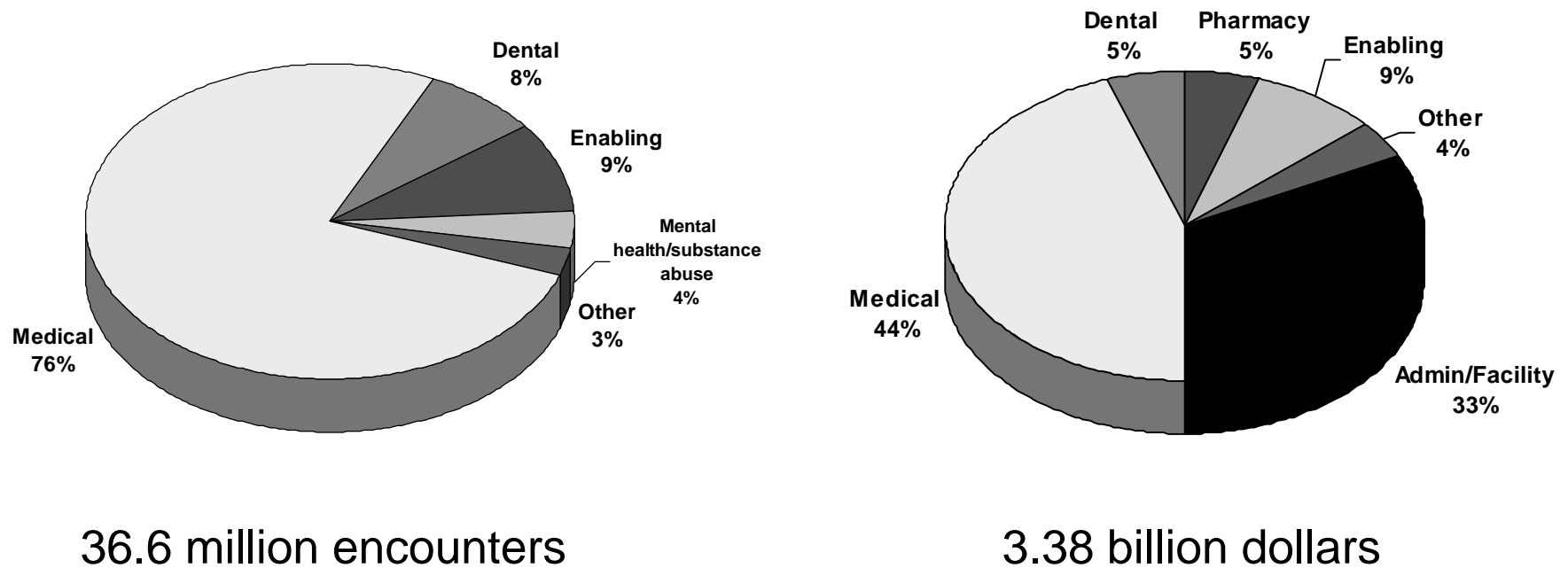
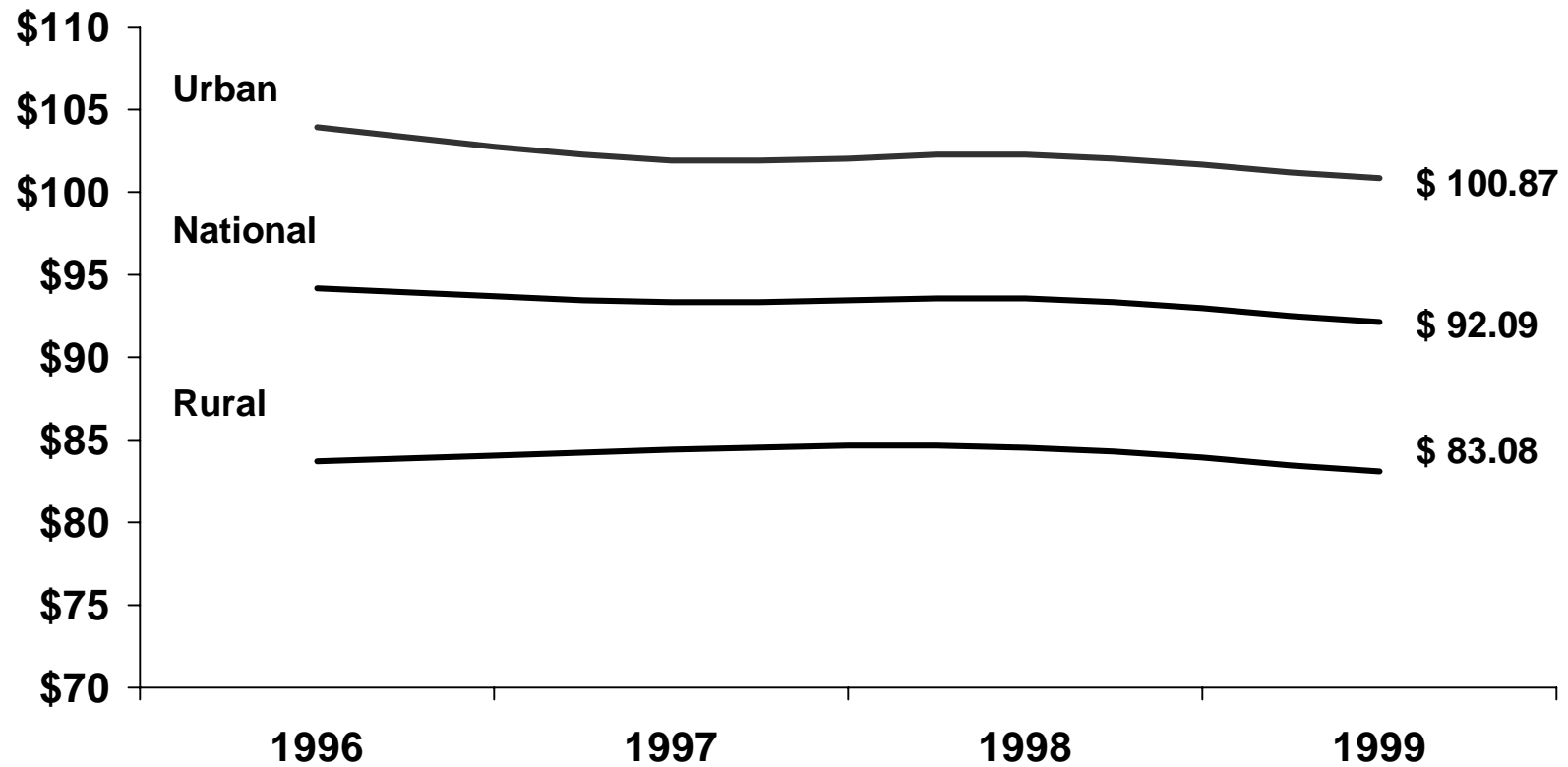
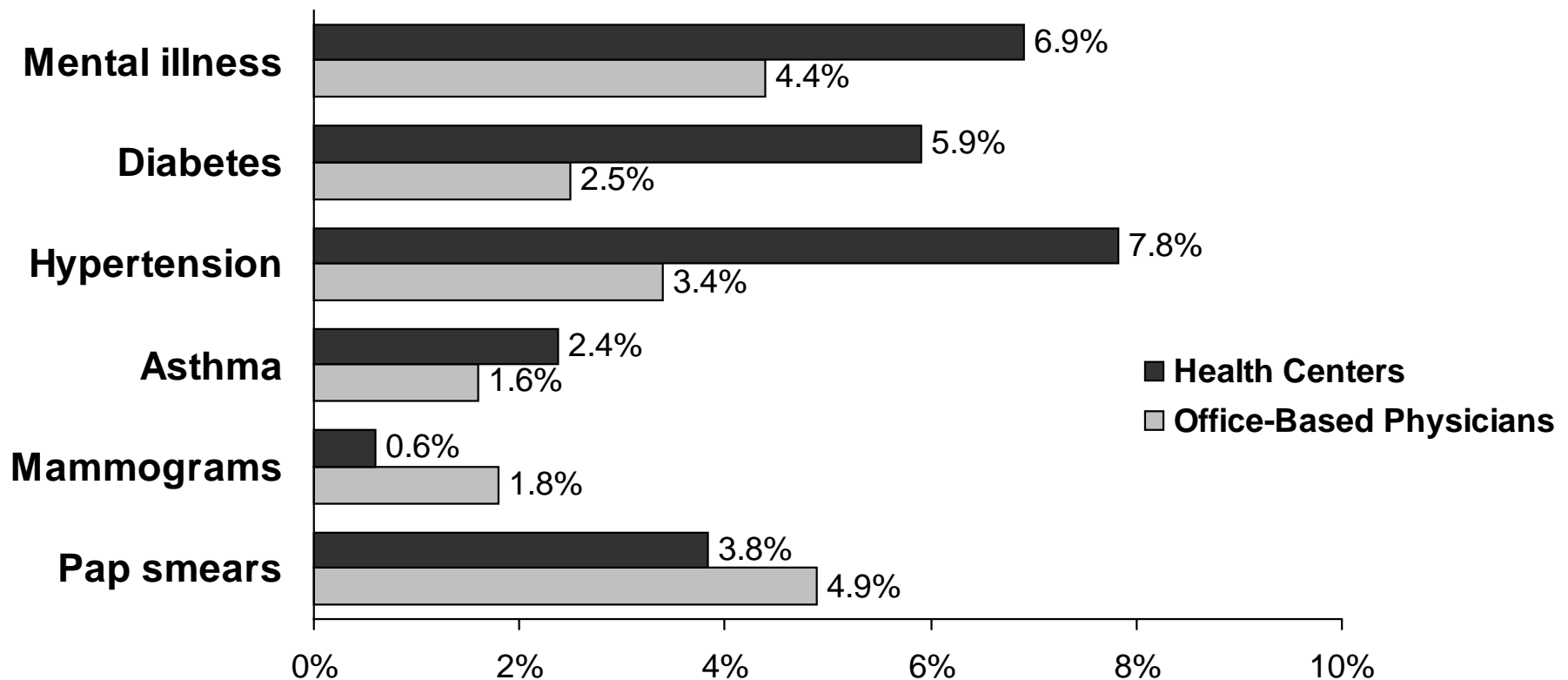


Figure 13. Medical Cost per Medical Encounter

Figure 15. Percent of Health Center Third Party Revenues Derived from Managed Care

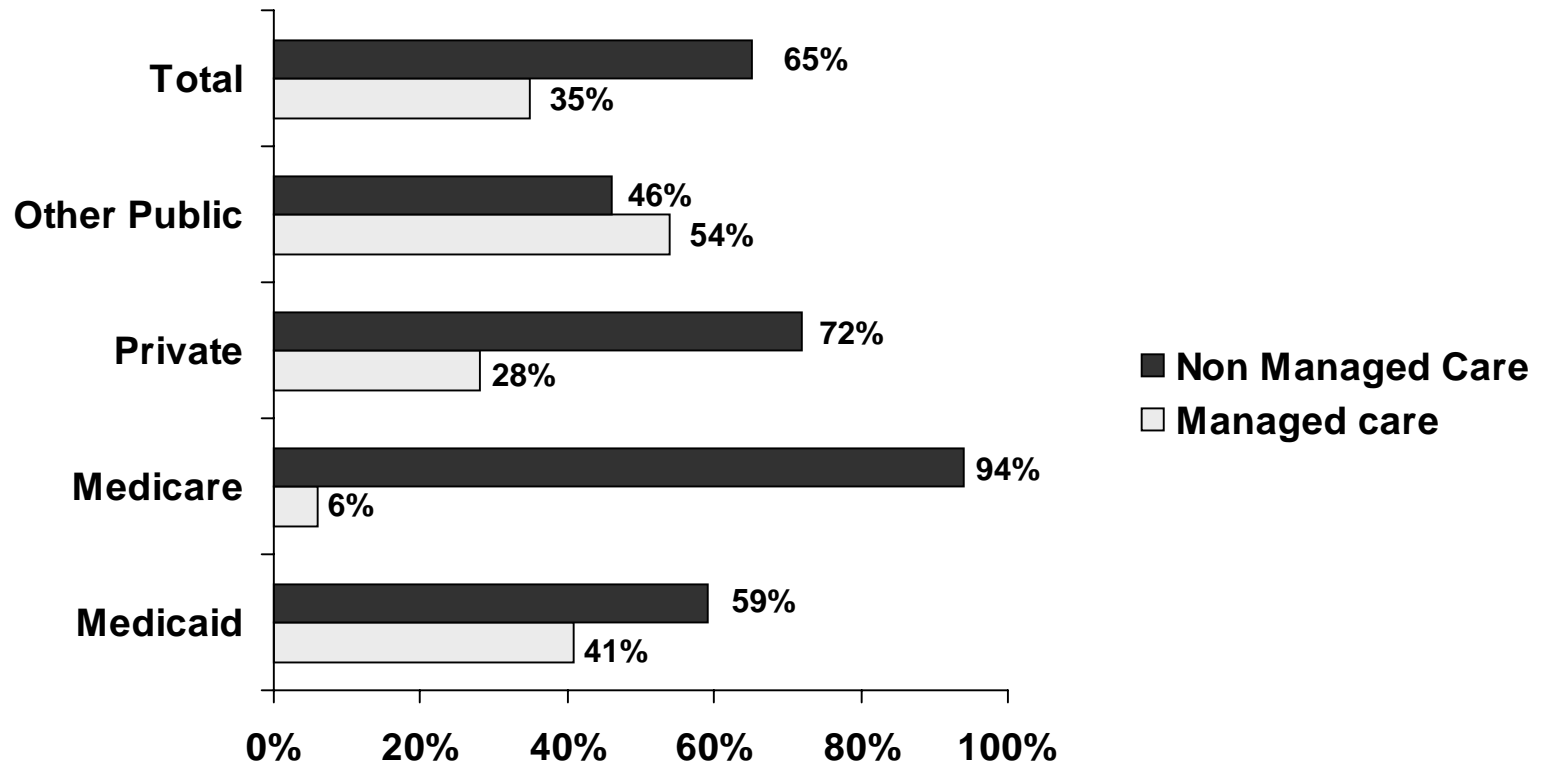
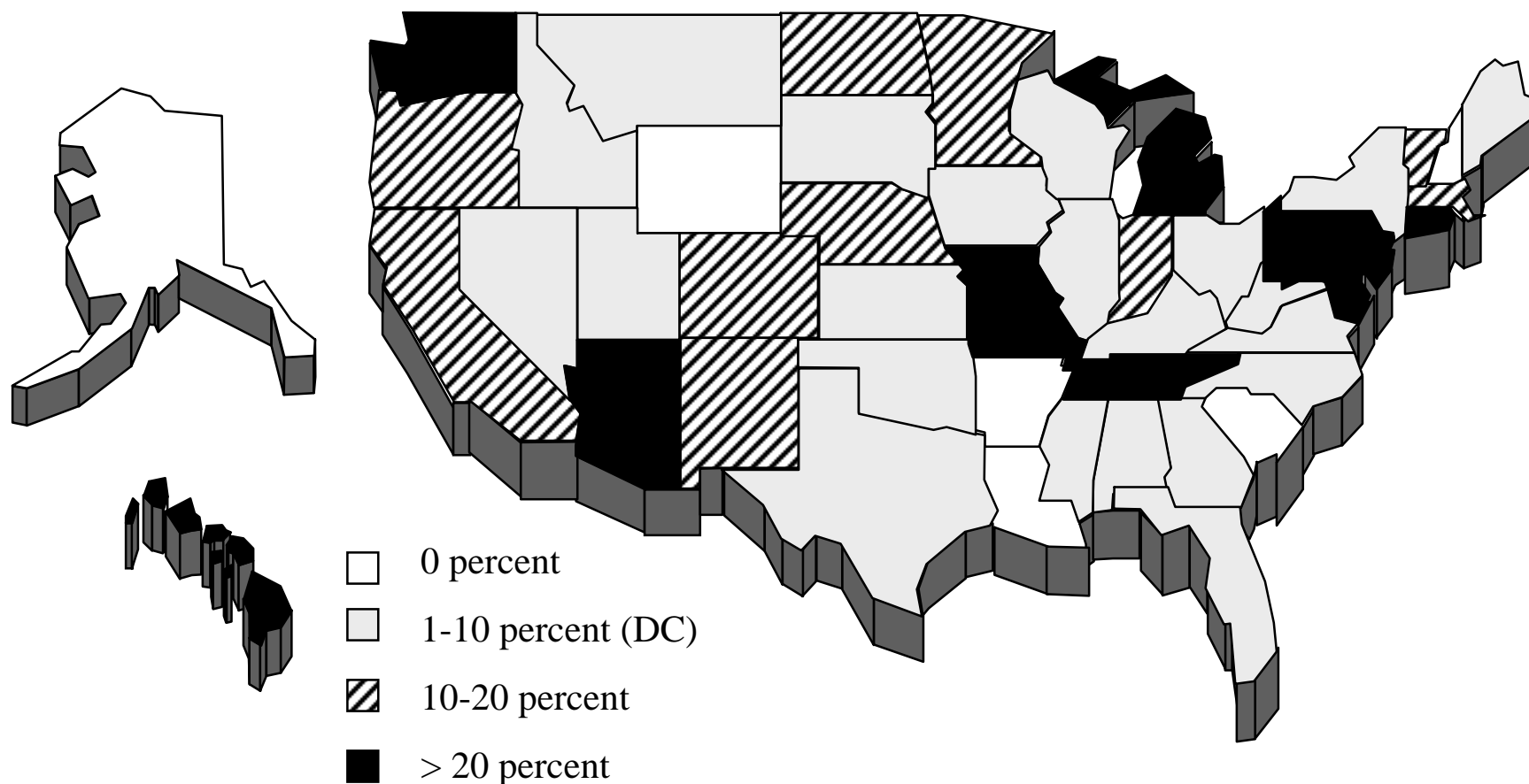


Figure 16. Health Center Managed Care Revenue as Percent of Total Revenues by State, 1999
