

**The Geiger Gibson Capstone Program
in
Health Policy and Leadership
April 16-18, 2012**

The Geiger Gibson Capstone Program in Health Policy and Leadership is being offered through a partnership between the Department of Health Policy in the GWU School of Public Health and Health Services and the National Association of Community Health Center's Leadership Development Institutes. The program is designed to provide participants with the knowledge needed to understand U.S. health policy trends and their implications for community health centers. Special emphasis is placed on current and emerging health reform implementation issues. Program speakers come from senior levels of Washington DC's health policy leadership community, both inside and outside of government.

Capstone Goals:

- To gain familiarity with the roles of the legislative, executive, and judicial branches in health policy development and implementation
- To provide a foundation for CHC leaders interested in influencing regional and national health policy directions

Capstone Learning Objectives:

- To gain familiarity with key health policy issues affecting health centers and medically underserved communities
- To gain familiarity with the federal health policymaking process and how policy influences legislation and subsequent programs
- To gain familiarity with policy issues in health reform implementation
- To interact with policy analysts and policymakers
- To become familiar with policy-related CHC health services research

Audience: The Capstone is designed to meet the professional needs of mid-level and senior level staff that are pursuing executive leadership careers in CHCs.

Participant Selection Process:

Participation is limited to twenty attendees per cycle to foster an interactive learning experience. Interested CHC staff should contact their State/Regional PCA which handles all application, registration and payment arrangements with GWU.

Location and Cost:

The Capstone program is held in the Department of Health Policy in Washington, DC. The program fee is \$750.00 per participant, not including travel, lodging and meal expenses. Guest rooms are available near GWU at a discounted rate. Participants will contact the hotel directly to make a reservation and arrange for payment.
