



## LYNN R. GOLDMAN, M.D., M.P.H.

Lynn R. Goldman, a pediatrician and an epidemiologist, is a Professor in the Department of Environmental Health Sciences and chair of the Interdepartmental Program in Applied Public Health at the Johns Hopkins University Bloomberg School of Public Health, where her areas of focus are public health practice, children's environmental health, disaster preparedness, and chemical and pesticide regulatory policy. Dr. Goldman is Principal Investigator for the Hopkins National Children's Study Center. As Assistant Administrator for Toxic Substances at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, she directed the Office of Prevention, Pesticides and Toxic Substances (OPPTS) from 1993 through 1998. Prior to joining the EPA, Dr. Goldman served as head of the Division of Environmental and Occupational Disease Control of the California Department of Health Services. She has a BS in Conservation of Natural Resources from the University of California, Berkeley, an MPH from the Johns Hopkins University School of Public Health, and an MD from the University of California, San Francisco. She completed pediatric training at Children's Hospital, Oakland, California and is board certified in pediatrics. Dr. Goldman has served on numerous boards and expert committees, including the Committee on Environmental Health of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Centers for Disease Control Lead Poisoning Prevention Advisory Committee. Dr. Goldman is a member of the Institute of Medicine, vice chairman of the Institute of Medicine Roundtable on Environmental Health Sciences and a member of the Institute of Medicine Board on Health Sciences Policy.
