The Department of Exercise Science of the GWU School of Public Health and Health Services is seeking a senior level individual in Clinical Exercise Physiology.

The Department of Exercise Science has an active research program, much of which is interdisciplinary, involving other departments on campus and in the community. The department offers a Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise Science with majors in Athletic Training or Exercise Science and a Master's degree in Exercise Science with concentrations in Exercise, Nutrition and Eating Behavior; Strength & Conditioning; and Clinical Exercise Physiology. The successful candidate will teach in and coordinate the Clinical Exercise Physiology concentration, coordinate clinical placements, assist in teaching other Exercise Science courses, as needed, and advise Master's theses projects. The position involves both classroom teaching and supervising clinical experiences at selected hospitals and clinical sites in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. This is a 12-month non-tenure track appointment beginning July 1, 2009.

Basic Qualifications: Applicants must have a terminal degree in Exercise Science or related field and strong verbal and written communication skills. Applicants must have experience in both directing clinical programs and teaching clinical exercise physiology. Applicants must demonstrate a record of external funding and publications in his or her area of interest.

Preferred Qualifications: Preference will be given to applicants who are nationally and/or internationally recognized in the field of Clinical Exercise Physiology, have extensive clinical experience, and have a record of significant professional achievements.

Review of applications will begin on December 1, 2008 and will continue until the position is filled. Applications from women and minorities are strongly encouraged.
