The Department of Exercise Science of the GWU School of Public Health and Health Services is seeking qualified applicants for a tenure-track assistant professor position in sport and exercise psychology.

The Department of Exercise Science has an active interdisciplinary research program involving other departments on campus and within the community. The department offers a Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise Science with majors in Exercise Science or Athletic Training; and, a Master's degree in Exercise Science with concentrations in Exercise, Nutrition, and Eating Behavior, Strength and Conditioning, and Clinical Exercise Physiology. The successful candidate will teach core classes at both the undergraduate and graduate levels, advise students, chair and serve on Master's theses, and maintain an active research agenda. This is a 12-month tenure-track appointment beginning July 1, 2009.

**Basic Qualifications:** Doctorate required in Sport and Exercise Psychology or related field with experience in individual, group, and community counseling. Applicants must have strong verbal and written communication skills, and a demonstrated ability to advise students and direct Master's theses. Experience in the applied aspects of both sport and exercise psychology is desired (e.g., working with athletes/teams and overweight and obese populations).

**Preferred Qualifications:** Preference will be given to applicants that are Certified Consultants by the Association for Applied Sport Psychology (CC-AASP) and are National Certified Counselors through the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC); have evidence of excellent teaching skills; have experience teaching sport psychology, exercise psychology, and psychology of injury and performance at both the undergraduate and graduate levels; have active behavioral research agendas in areas such as cross-cultural aggression, youth sport, professional practice issues, and exercise adherence theory/intervention; have a collaborative publication record; and demonstrate the potential to secure external funding.
