



Faculty Position in Global Environmental Health

The Department of Environmental and Occupational Health and the Department of Global Health invite applications for a faculty position in global environmental health. This individual will be jointly appointed in both departments and is expected to develop and direct a new MPH concentration in global environmental health. This position will be tenure-track or tenured at the Assistant, Associate, or Professor rank, commensurate with experience.

The George Washington University School of Public Health and Health Services is fully accredited, with vigorous programs of undergraduate and graduate research and education. The Department of Environmental and Occupational Health is at the center of national and global conversations about using science to protect workers, the public, and the environment from toxic substances and dangerous conditions. Basic Qualifications: Applicants must have a doctoral degree in a relevant public health, medical, or legal discipline, environmental health experience in developing countries, and experience teaching and mentoring students. Applicants at the rank of Associate Professor or Professor must have a solid publication record and have demonstrated the ability to obtain research funding. Applicants seeking consideration at the Assistant Professor level must have demonstrated potential for external funding and peer reviewed publications.

Preferred Qualifications: Preference will be given to candidates with strong verbal and written communication skills, who have demonstrated a history of collaborative work, and who have significant expertise in at least one and preferably several of the following areas: water, sanitation, climate change, air pollution, natural resources, food and agriculture, and sustainability. Persons whose experience also encompasses global environmental health policy and regulation are strongly encouraged to apply.

Application Procedure: To be considered, please submit: (1) a curriculum vitae; (2) a letter of interest describing teaching and mentoring experience, research interests, and plans for maintaining or developing an independently funded research program; and (3) complete contact information for at least three references. Only complete applications will be considered. Review of applications will begin on February 8, 2010 and will continue until the position is filled.
