The Department of Exercise Science of the GWU School of Public Health and Health Services is seeking a tenure track Assistant/Associate Professor of Exercise Science with a focus area in Nutrition and/or Dietetics.

The Department of Exercise Science has an active research program, much of which is interdisciplinary, involving other departments on campus and in the community. Current research includes regulation of fat metabolism and causes of obesity, movement analysis, neuromuscular adaptations to resistance training, and the behavioral and societal factors that influence exercise activity. The department offers a Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise Science with majors in Athletic Training or Exercise Science and a Master's degree in Exercise Science with concentrations in Exercise, Nutrition and Eating Behavior, Strength & Conditioning, and Clinical Exercise Physiology. The successful candidate will teach undergraduate and graduate nutrition courses, assist in teaching other Exercise Science courses as needed, advise Master's theses, advise undergraduates, conduct independent research, and seek external research support. This is a 12-month tenure-track appointment beginning August 1, 2009.

Basic Qualifications: Applicants must have a terminal degree in Exercise Science, Nutrition or related field, and strong verbal and written communication skills. Applicants must demonstrate the potential to seek external funding and to perform research in their areas of interest.

Preferred Qualifications: Preference will be given to applicants who hold a RD credential and have expertise in exercise science as well as advanced nutrition, metabolism, and community nutrition.

Review of applications will begin on January 5, 2008 and will continue until the position is filled. Applications from women and people of color are strongly encouraged.
