The Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics is recruiting for a dynamic full-time, tenure-track faculty member at the Assistant or Associate Professor level.

Basic Qualifications: A doctoral degree in Microbiology or Virology; with a minimum of 2 years of postdoctoral experience in Molecular Virology; a strong peer-reviewed publication record and experience in external grant writing.

Preferred Qualifications: Expertise in molecular technology; a strong verbal and written communication skills and fluency in English; a strong interest in translational research, public health, global health and point-of-care-diagnostics for low resource settings; graduate-level teaching experience (or equivalent); and fluency in at least one language other than English.

The responsibilities of this exciting position will be threefold: 1) Research – develop and maintain an externally funded research program; 2) Education – develop and teach courses for a new doctoral program in Public Health Microbiology and Emerging Infectious Diseases and 3) Service – contribute to the Department and University, and to the field of public health laboratory science.

Review of applications will begin on May 15, 2010 and will continue until the position is filled. Applications from women and minorities are strongly encouraged. Rank and salary will be commensurate with experience.

The Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics is committed to expanding the depth and breadth of our Public Health Laboratory Science Program. Relevant and ongoing Department activities include an active microbiology and virology research laboratory directed by Dr. Jeanne Jordan; funded collaborations with the NIH, the HIV Prevention Trials Network, private industry, and the Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation; a Master of Science degree in Public Health Microbiology and Emerging Infectious Diseases in collaboration with the George Washington School of Medicine and Health Sciences, Department of Microbiology, Immunology and Tropical Medicine; the International Institute of Public Health Laboratory Management in collaboration with the Association of Public Health Laboratories, and established collaborations with the GW HIV/AIDS Institute and the Division of Infectious Diseases in the Department of Medicine.
